The map of the simulation laboratories in medicine education in the North-

Eastern universities of DR Congo

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Introduction: With the storage of the BMD system in the DR Congo at University or College

level, the Congolese physician training program provides for the development of a simulation

laboratory for practical lessons. But few things are known about simulation in medical education

in the DR Congo. The objective of this study is to develop a mapping of laboratories about

simulation in medicine in the some universities in the North-Eastern of the DR Congo.

Methods: It's about a cross sectional study running from 1st to 31st March 2022 in universities

which organize within their different institutions the Faculty of Medicine, such as University of

Kisangani, University of Bunia, University of Uele, Shaloom University, Free University of

Bumba, which are located in the the North-Eastern part of the DR Congo. The data were

collected from a pre-established questionnaire using closed and opened questions through

telephone interview. The variables of interest concerned the knowledge of the university

teachers on the simulation clinic and the existence of an operational clinical simulation

laboratory in the university site.

Results: This study shows that only 20 % (1/5) of the universities located in the North-Eastern

of the DRC have a simulation laboratory in medical education. The majority of trainers (70%)

has heard of a simulation clinic. The majority of the staff (90 percent) is not trained in this

matter.

Conclusion: Clinical simulation is little known in Congolese universities. In view of the

observation, there is a need to train Congolese teachers and provide the faculties of medicine

with clinical simulation laboratories to improve the quality of the training for doctors across the

country.
